# Carmichael Canadian art Lecture 2007

Franklin Carmichael (1890-1945), a founding member of the group of seven, was born in Orillia. These annual lectures celebrate the wider legacy of Canadian artistic vision in shaping our national identity.

Tom Thomson, is considered one of the most important and influential early Canadian artists. Together with members of the group of seven, he created a distinct approach to portraying Canadian through rugged landscapes.

## Tom Thomson: the Man, the myth



In this engrossing illustrated lecture, Stuart Reid, director of the Tom Thomson Memorial Art Gallery, will explore Thomson's artistic development within the context of the historical Canadian nationalistic period from which he emerged, wider world events, and family life.

Stuart Reid has been director and curator of the Tom Thomson Memorial Art Gallery in Owen Sound since 2001. He is the author of over 30 exhibition catalogues and several books.
